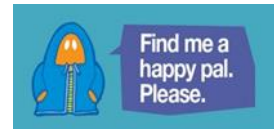

February 2018: PATTIE KLIMEK



Lecture: “CRAZY QUILT’S- Today and Yesterday” Pattie Klimek, a resident of San Francisco, teaches quilting classes and lectures for guilds and quilt shops. She will bring several crazy quilts to show during her lecture. I’d like to encourage guild members to bring their crazy quilts for show and tell.

Sunday workshop: MAKE A CRAZY QUILT

Starting with a muslin foundation, Pattie will teach us how to transfer our pattern using the flip and sew method by hand or machine. We will learn how to sew curved pieces and how to handle fancy fabrics, such as velvets, silks and upholstery fabrics. We will also learn how to embellish our crazy quilt blocks with embroidery, buttons, lace and silk ribbon. Finishing the quilt will also be discussed using the envelope method. Cost of the class will be \$25 !

We want to fill the class, if we fall short of member sign-ups, the class will be offered to quilters outside our guild !

March: SHEILA COLLINS Our speaker is Sheila Collins she will speak about her Creative Journey from Fashion Designer to Graphic Designer to Fabric Artist. No workshop in March as the SVWC is not available.



April: ANELIE BELDEN

Lecture: “IRON ON TUESDAY”, History of Ironing will be presented by Anelie Belden. Listen to interesting stories about the development of irons through time.



Sunday Workshop: JELLY ROLL/SPLIT BLADE DRESDEN,. This class will be detailing how to make a “Split Blade” Dresden that are made using 2 1/2” strips (Jelly Rolls). Anelie will teach us using her Modern methods using her stitch-n-flip technique. So ladies get out one of those Jelly Rolls you've been saving and make a Dresden Plate with Anelie Belden. Cost of Class is: \$25

2018 Quilt Show – Barbara Haddon

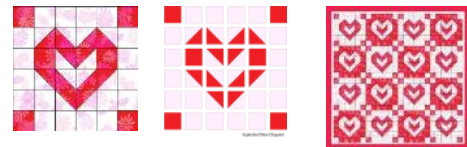

2018 Contract for Lakeport Senior Activity Center is pending

2017 Government forms filed: CA SI Statement of Information filed 12/23/17; CA RRF1 Registration Renewal Fee 1/1/18; CA 199N filed 1/1/18.

2017 Government filings pending: IRS 990N website not available so cannot file yet, 1099 Misc forms will be filed by 1/31/18

A request was made to create a crazy quilt to be sold at LakeWorks. This request was approved.

Marj Sweeney requested a consideration to reorganize the flow of the general meeting. Many ideas were discussed. There will be a couple of changes made at the next meeting to see if the flow improves.

Jane Alameda will be working with other close guilds to share in cost effectiveness of bringing in speakers and providing classes. Classes will be open to other local guild members and the public to increase the number of attendees if needed. There was also discussion to add classes to teach skills for new quilters.

Terry is going to review with the Membership Chairman what is provided to new members in the new member folder. A suggestion will be made to have mentors for new members to help them know all the activities available to them both during the meetings and each month.

Terry will be checking with all Chairmen to review and update their policy/procedures binders.

Connie reported that the website is undergoing some revisions. This will be done with as little downtime as possible. As the Web Editor, Connie will also be the Communications Media Representative for organizations such as NCQC (Northern California Quilt Council)

The quilt guilds in Ukiah and Oroville have requested to present their Op Quilts at future meetings; Ukiah in February and Oroville in June. Approval granted by Terry.

Linda Morrison suggested that our May birthday guild meeting include an auction of donated fabrics and supplies. Proceeds from this auction will go to the guild. This suggestion was approved.

Marj reported that the quilt show can no longer be held at Lewis Hall at the Lake County Fairgrounds but will be held in two buildings: the Little Theater and Fritch Hall. There will be vendors and quilt displays in both buildings.

The meeting was adjourned at 1:35.
