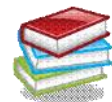

Marjan's presentation "Creative Exploration" is a humorous and educational slide lecture with a trunk show. You will learn about her untraditional approach to quilting and how she creates her hand dyed fabrics.



Sunday Workshop: Dyed Fabrics: They're ir-rest-able: Learn to create your own beautiful hand-dyed fabrics! You will become familiar with the principles of color theory, fabric dyeing using Procion fiber reactive dyes, and many surface design techniques such as immersion dyeing to create color progressions or value gradations; dye painting; bleach discharge; resist techniques; shibori; stamping and stenciling.

We want to fill our classes, if we fall short of member sign-ups, the class will be offered to quilters outside our guild !

OR Please see the website LLQG.org for a copy of the instructions. Be sure to add 2 inches of white background fabric to the top and bottom and both sides to make a 12” square. If you make two, you will end up with samples of 12” blocks to make a quilt.

Ladies of the Lake Quilt Meeting Minutes, April 14, 2018

General Meeting

The meeting was called to order by President Terry Phelps at 10:02 am

Members and Guests: There were no guests today. Audrey Ericson is a new member.

Treasurer Report: Treasurer Sandra Redshaw reported an income of \$1037.00 and expenses of 1179.99 with a net loss of \$142.99 for the month of March.

Program: Jane Alameda introduced the speaker Anelie Belden and her talk “Iron On Tuesday”. Anelie displayed her large collection of irons and talked about their evolution through the ages. Sunday’s class is “Jelly Roll/Split Blade Dresden”.

Upcoming Programs: May is the Guild’s Birthday Party. It will include both a silent auction and live auction of fabrics, quilts and quilting related items. Proceeds will go to the guild to support future programs. There will also be a book sale to benefit the purchase of new books for the guild library. Shelly Aldrich will give a talk on how the guild was originally formed.

The speaker at the June meeting will be Mel Beach who will present her “Challenge Yourself!” Lecture and Trunk Show. A class on Sun-day will be “Slice of Improv Workshop”.

The speaker in July will be Arlene Arnold. In August there will be a class on fabric dying.

Chairman Reports and Announcements:

Baby Quilts: Chairman Lan Ai–Adeeb indicated there is a need for at least 12 baby quilts for the hospital. Members are reminded that they need to sign out quilt kits and sign them back in when the completed quilts are turned in.

Library: Chairman Kerry Hansing reported that the cart to hold the books is broken and will be replaced. A selection of books is being displayed on a table. Books and patterns will be for sale during the May Birthday celebration.

Quilt Show: Chairman Barbara Hadden announced that the position of Door Prize Chairman has not yet been filled. Since the quilt show will be in two buildings at the fairgrounds we need a car to display a large quilt that will advertise the show. The car will be located between the two buildings. The quilt will fit a full size sedan such as a Taurus. Barbara Dore made a request that members think about items such as doll quilts, table runners, pot holders, totes that can be displayed as vignettes during the quilt show. Vignette entry forms will be available on the website along with the quilt entry form. Nancy Helldorfer said she has sent out 44 letters to possible vendors. Seven vendors have confirmed attendance at this point. Barbara Mahoney made a request for members to think about items that they would like to donate to the Silent Auction. Suzanne Hoyt asked for someone to help distribute signs for the show. Pam Ayle is looking for workers to help with setup and cleanup.

Mystery Quilt: Clue #3 is available today and is available on the website along with the first two clues. Finished quilts will be shown during the May meeting.

Fire Quilts: Betty Fessler announced that the next gathering to work on quilts for fire survivors will be on Sunday April 29 at Nancy Helldorfer's. There is a potluck for lunch.

Back to Basics: Jane Alameda reported that in March there were 10 attendees. The classes are the third Wednesday of each month upstairs at Umpqua Bank. Teachers are Marj Sweeney, Linda Morrison and Sandy Leggitt.

Ways and Means: Gail Coyle announced that the guild received \$135 in sales from Lake Works. Five quilts were sold. The inventory is now low so items are requested that can be sold such as potholders and bibs. Blocks are being collected to make another quilt to sell.

Block of the Month: The winner of this month's blocks is Leanne Harvey. Directions for the May block "Butterfly" are available on the website.

BOARD MEETING

MINUTES

The meeting was called to order by President Terry Phelps at 12:25

Present: Terry Phelps, Jane Alameda, Kathy Pratt, Sandra Redshaw, Kerry Hansing, Dottie Kauffman, Nancy Helldorfer, Deborah Miller, Linda Morrison, Marj Sweeney, Shirley Viada

Old Business:

Treasurer Sandy Redshaw presented an inventory of the Assets for the guild which has a total value of \$49,644.13.

Sandy also reported that if the guild opens money placed in a CD at the bank will accrue a higher interest rate that it is currently earning in the checking account. Nancy Helldorfer made a motion that an amount of \$15,000 be placed in a CD. Linda Morrison seconded the motion. Following discussion a vote was held and the motion was unanimously approved.

New Business:

Kerry Hansing has been researching how much it will cost to replace the broken book cart for the library. The best option is a 6 shelf metal cart that is available online for \$272.69 including shipping. Nancy Helldorfer made a motion that the guild purchase this cart. Sandy Redshaw seconded the motion. After discussion a vote was held and the motion was unanimously approved.

Linda Morrison requested approval by the Board for the program for the May Birthday meeting. Following a welcome in which how the auction will be done, Shelly Aldrich, guild founder, will give a talk on how the guild was formed. There will be a break during which the attendees may bid/buy items in the auction. This will be followed by lunch and Show and Tell. There will be no Treasure Chest.

Marj Sweeney had some questions regarding the Guild Budget. These questions were discussed. She also brought up concern about member retention and discussion was held. The Back-to-Basics concept is going to be brought into the guild meetings to provide learning opportunities to all guild attendees.

The meeting was adjourned at 1:47 pm
