I have put the "I Spy" block and instructions information on the Ways and Means Page of our website. This is the block we will be making for the Lakeworks Quilt Project due in November/December.

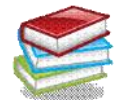

The meeting was called to order by President Terry Phelps at 10:00 am.

A Budget Committee must be selected. It must consist of the Treasurer, Treasurer Elect, Quilt Show Chairman and two guild members. Betty Fessler and Sue Schedler volunteered to be on this committee.

Cindy Martelle announced that there is a person who needs help with assembling and learning how to use a Pfaff longarm with frame. Please contact Cindy if you can help. Pam Ayle announced that today there is a craft faire happening at the Finley Grange Hall. All are welcome.

Board of Directors nominations: The nominating committee has announced their nominations for the Board offices. They are:

**Treasurer Report:** Income for the month of October was \$10,443.38. Expenses were \$1,770.09 for a net income of \$9,042.40. For the Quilt Show itself, year-to-date, the Total Income was \$13,803.50 and Total Expenses was \$5,985.49 for a Total Net Income of \$7,818.01.

**Program:** Program Chairman Jane Alameda introduced our speaker for today, Gretchen Crozier who brought us a trunk show of many of her quilts, many of them done in response to challenges. One of her quilts won a First Place at PIQF and also appeared on the cover of a quilting magazine.

Tomorrow is a class at Scotts Valley Women's Center in which participants will learn to use coloring crayons and other embellishments to create a block.

### **Upcoming Programs:**

**December:** This will be the guild annual Christmas party. Members with last name L-Z are requested to bring food. There will be games and a gift exchange. The gift can be hand made or store bought. We will play a game where each member (or guest) winds up with a different ornament.
