JUST A FEW LAST MINUTE REMINDERS AND..... IT'S SHOW TIME

LABEL & FOLDING INSTRUCTIONS:

- * Complete label. **MUST HAVE TITLE**—this is how your quilt is identified
- * For Quilts: Facing the back side of the quilt, **baste** label on lower right corner
- * For other items: Basted label on inside bottom of garment, or on back of pillow, table runner
- * Fold quilt wrong side out so that the label is prominent

ENTRY DROP-OFF INSTRUCTIONS:

- * Deliver **ALL** entries on Thursday, October 3rd, 2019, to Fritch Hall, Lake County Fairgrounds
- * Judged items: Must arrive between 8:00 & 9:30 a.m.
- * Non-Judged Only Items: Must arrive between 8:00—10:00 a.m.
- * Times include Vignettes
- * **NO ITEMS WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER THEIR CUT-OFF TIME**
- * You will be given a receipt for each entry item. Be sure to verify accuracy & retain for pick-up on Sunday

PICK-UP INSTRUCTIONS:

- * Sunday, October 6th, 2019 at Fritch Hall from 5:00—6:00 p.m..**MUST HAVE RECEIPTS. NO entry will be released without a receipt.**

Gearing up for the Show !



Those of you who are planning to sell items at the Country Store, please have your items and paperwork ready to go, and deliver to the Little Theater at the Fairgrounds on Thursday (preferably) or Friday.

If you're selling items or have in the past, PLEASE consider working a shift in the store, we need your help to be successful !

Be sure to put a red mark on your tags for the items that will go Half Price on Sunday. I would ask that the items going half off, be priced with even numbers; i.e., \$4 to \$2, \$10 to \$5, etc.

You may use colored paper for your price tags, EXCEPT green!

On Sunday, please come to the Country Store as close to 4:00 p.m. as possible to pick up your unsold items.

COUNTRY STORE PRICE TAGS

1. CUT ON DOTTED LINES AND ATTACH DOUBLE TAG TO EACH ITEM -- (second tag is customers copy)
2. "No. " on the price tag is combo of your assigned initials and line number on inventory sheet, ex: JAD-8
3. FILL OUT INVENTORY SHEET TO MATCH ITEMS -- (turn in with items, NO SHEET, NO SALE if not 100% donated)

MEETING MINUTES

Ladies of the Lake Quilt Guild Meeting Minutes, September 14, 2019

General Meeting

The meeting was called to order by President Terry Phelps at 10:00 am

Members and Guests: There were 49 members in attendance and two guests; Laureen Neilly and Carol Nugent.

Treasurer Report: Treasurer Kitty Jones reported an income of \$2,448.00 and expenses of \$2,899.81 for a net balance of -\$451.81 for the month of August. The guild is now using an outside accountant for many responsibilities of this position.

Program: Quilt-O time. In lieu of a speaker, members “paid” for Quilt-O cards with fat quarters and we played a few games. Winners won the fat quarters.

Upcoming Programs:

The speaker for November will be Gretchen Crozier. There will be a class on Sunday using colored pencils to create a design. Class maximum is 15.

December will be the annual guild Christmas party and installation of officers for the new year.

Quilt Show: This is the last guild meeting before the show on October 5 and 6. There will be no guild meeting in October.

Barbara Haddon said quilts must be turned in on Thursday Oct. 3 from 8 am to 10 am. The check-in committee must be there at 7:30 am. Signs for the show need to be put up all over the county. Suzanne Hoyt has signs available. The next show meeting will be Monday September 16 at 10 am at Umpqua Bank. All show chairmen need to be there. Barbara has a PowerPoint presentation about working at the show that can be viewed by volunteers during the break. Some members who don't have a computer need assistance obtaining tags for Country Store items. They are to make arrangements with Barbara to get these tags and inventory sheets.

Linda Jensen will be driving the LLQG “quilt car” in the Kelseyville Pear festival and needs members to sew pears to hang on the car. She has a pattern for making them.

Shery Loewen still has some openings in the schedule for volunteers to man some of the positions. She will have the sign-up sheets at the front of the room at break time. Linda Morrison helped her recruit.

Lianne Burger is in charge of announcing door prizes at the show. Some have already been donated by vendors and guild members. She can still accept donations. The main door prize of a sewing machine donated by Village Sewing will be announced on Sunday afternoon.

Betty Fessler announced that all theme baskets should have all items by now. The baskets must be turned in to the Little Theater Thursday or Friday before the show. They must have two printed copies of the basket contents

Library: Kerry Hansing announced that due to its weight the library cart is located in the side room at the front of the meeting hall. Since there is no guild meeting in October, if books are checked out today they can be kept for 3 months instead of the usual 2 months. There is one book that has a ruler with it. If that book is checked out a \$29 deposit must be made. When the ruler is returned with the book the deposit is refunded.
