MEETING MINUTES

Ladies of the Lake Quilt Guild Meeting Minutes, August 10, 2019

General Meeting

The meeting was called to order by President Terry Phelps at 10:02 a.m.

Members and Guests: We welcomed 52 members and 5 guests; Mary Vickers, President of the Ukiah guild, Daphne Martyn, Sandra Daggett, Julie Sahf (also joining as a new member) and Kim Darnell.

Treasurer Report: Kitty Jones reported an income of \$804.10 for the month of July with expenses of \$1982.60 for a net loss of \$1178.50.

Announcements: President Terry Phelps announced that a new nominating committee is needed to identify candidates for the new Board whose terms will begin in January. Volunteering for this committee are Shirley Liskey, Rebecca Scroggins and Linda Morrison. Candidates will be presented and voted on at the November guild meeting.

Program: Jane Alameda introduced our speaker for today, Scarlett Rose who has been quilting since she was a teenager and has been a judge for many years. Scarlett talked about what judges look for when judging a show using several quilts brought in by guild members. It was very interesting to learn about all her years in the quilt judging world.

Upcoming Programs: Jane announced that the program for September will be a surprise.

Chairman Reports:

Ways and Means: Gail Coyle announced that we need to have items to sell at Lake-Works with holiday themes.

Quilt Show:

Chairman Barbara Haddon had several guild members display examples of various quilt categories, especially emphasizing the difference between miniature and small quilts and the various forms of art, naturescape and landscape quilts.

There are fliers and bookmarks and packets of both available at the back of the room for members to pick up and distribute around the area to advertise the show.

Volunteers are needed for several areas at the show: Silent Auction, Country Store, Welcome Table, Quilt take-in and handout, White Glove

Linda Morrison says we need a lot more quilt entries for the show. At this point she has 94 and we need about 200.

Theme baskets: every table announced their theme. If anyone has items for any of the baskets, they must bring them to the September meeting at the very latest.

Betty Fessler has cellophane and ribbons for the baskets.

Barbara Dore says she has room for a few more vignettes.

BOARD MEETING

MINUTES

Call to Order: President Terry Phelps called the meeting to order at 12:55 pm

Present: Terry Phelps, Jane Alameda, Kathy Pratt, Kitty Jones, Barbara Haddon, Betty Fessler, Linda Morrison, Marj Sweeney.

Old Business:

Linda Morrison is progressing with looking at the grange hall in Finley as a possible new guild meeting location. There have been ongoing issues with the Lakeport Senior Center as our meeting place.

Marj Sweeney asked if there is an update to the question of how to best handle and report the proceeds from the Country Store since the guild only actually keeps 25% of the proceeds. Kitty has been trying to meet with our accountant but has not been able to yet. Jane will try to assist in having this meeting.

New Business:

Kitty presented information about splitting the position of treasurer between two people to reduce the workload and provide a means of backup. Also, having the outside Accountant handle Quick Books was discussed. More will be discussed about this moving forward and it will be recommended to the nominating committee to identify two members for the treasurer position. It was again stressed that the nominating committee must move forward as soon as possible with nominations for the new year.

Affiliate update: Friends Around the Block has paid their fee for 2019. It will be stressed to all affiliates that the fee for each year is due at the beginning of the year.

Barbara Haddon announced that the printing of the Quilt Show fliers went over budget by \$58. The total spent was \$233.57 and the budget was \$175.00. Linda Morrison moved to approve the additional amount. Marj Sweeney seconded the motion. After discussion it was unanimously approved. The budget amount may need to be raised for the 2020 Quilt Show.

Betty Fessler requested approval for an amount of \$165.00 for supplies for Theme Basket tickets. A lot of this is for a one-time purchase of some items since the guild is handling this for the first time. A member's husband had done it in the past. Linda Morrison made a motion that this amount be approved, and Kathy Pratt seconded it. After discussion it was unanimously approved. An expense for this category may need to be added to the Quilt Show budget for 2020.

Barbara Haddon asked for Board approval for a LakeWorks project to have members donate blocks to make an "I Spy" quilt. She will present this at the September meeting and give members a few months to turn in blocks. The Board approved this project.

The meeting was adjourned at 1:31 p.m.
