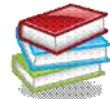

FEBRUARY—Linda Ballard Presentation: “What if I”

An avid sewer all her life, talented and well known traditional quilt instructor Linda believes there is something for everyone when it comes to quilting. Linda has been teaching all over Northern California, taught in Houston at Quilt Festival and will be teaching on her 15th cruise.

MARCH — Arlene Arnold - Lecture: “Stitches of Glory” 1830-1880 Quilts of the Civil War Era

Class: Free Motion Quilting



July: Marjan Kluepfel “Trunk Show of Artful Quilts”;
Class: Small Landscape

In this class you will learn to create a small landscape wall quilt (suitable for framing) using the following techniques: free motion machine embroidery, thread painting, bobbin drawing, couching, use of Sulky Solvy to make trees and shrubs, foiling, embellishing with Angelina fibers and Tyvek. Emphasis is on learning the techniques. Small landscape patterns will be provided to practice on.



Aug: Christine Barnes - Magic Fabrics / Special Effects

Put simply, magic fabrics give a quilt light and life. Some suggest light coming from below the surface (luminosity) or bouncing across the surface (luster). Others imply that see-through colors overlap to create new color mixtures (transparency). What constitutes a magic fabric? I describe many as “shot with light.” They usually display variations in value—light areas among darker areas, or light-to-dark gradations—and they typically contain warm colors. Batiks, hand-dyes, and hand-painted fabrics have a dappled quality; some commercial fabrics appear to “smolder,” an illusion that lends depth and warmth to even the simplest quilts. Class: Urban Sunsets
