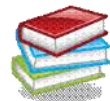

MEETING MINUTES

Ladies of the Lake Quilt Meeting Minutes, December 14, 2019

General Meeting

The meeting was called to order by President Terry Phelps at 10:00

Members and Guests: There were 41 guild members in attendance along with 2 guests; Euni Sloan and Larry Kauffman

Treasurer Report: Kitty Jones reported an income of \$675.60 and expenses of \$3706.17 for a net loss for November of -\$3030.57. The majority of the expenses was for the Quilt Show.

2020 Budget for LLQG and LLQG Quilt Show: Kitty Jones presented the budget for 2020. This budget includes changes for 8 items for the Guild and 3 changes for the Quilt Show. Terry Phelps motioned that the Budgets be accepted with the identified changes and Anna Polk seconded the motion. Following discussion the Budgets were approved by a unanimous vote of the membership.

Announcements:

Linda Morrison showed two sewing machines that were given to the Guild. One is a Bernina and one a vintage Singer. Both machines need some work to put in running condition. They can be purchased for \$20 each with the purchasers' knowledge that they will be responsible for any repairs. Both machines were quickly sold.

The Hospitality Committee has requested that no liquids be put into the garbage bags. Liquids must be disposed of in the sink at the back of the meeting room.

Linda Morrison also showed many Today's Quilter Magazines and the free notions included with each issue. A subscription is only \$39.95 for a year.

Program:

Installation of Officers for 2020: New officers installed are Sue Schedler and Shirley Liskey Co-Vice Presidents and Treasurer Pam Ayle. President Jane Alameda and Secretary Rebecca Scroggins could not be in attendance today so they will be installed at the January meeting at which point they will begin their new responsibilities.

Today is the annual Christmas Party to include tables loaded with a wide variety of food and a Christmas ornament exchange game.

June: Jill Schumacher will be speaking on “Creating Heirlooms of Tomorrow”. Sunday class will be how to do Free Motion Quilting on your domestic machine.

July: Marjan Kluepfel will be returning with her “Trunk Show of Artful Quilts”; The Sunday class will be to create a Small Landscape.

August: Our speaker Christine Barnes will be speaking on color theory. The class on Sunday is to be determined and will be announced in advance. There are a couple of quilts to choose from.

September: There will be small classes lead by guild members.

October: As usual the annual Falling Leaves Quilt Show will replace the meeting.

November: To be announced

December: Our annual Christmas Party and Installation of Officers for 2021.
