Class: Small Landscape



In this class you will learn to create a small landscape wall quilt (suitable for framing) using the following techniques: free motion machine embroidery, thread painting, bobbin drawing, couching, use of Sulky Solvy to make trees and shrubs, foiling, embellishing with Angelina fibers and Tyvek. Emphasis is on learning the techniques. Small landscape patterns will be provided to practice on.



Aug: Christine Barnes - Magic Fabrics / Special Effects

Put simply, magic fabrics give a quilt light and life. Some suggest light coming from below the surface (luminosity) or bouncing across the surface (luster). Others imply that see-through colors overlap to create new color mixtures (transparency).

What constitutes a magic fabric? I describe many as "shot with light." They usually display variations in value—light areas among darker areas, or light-to-dark gradations—and they typically contain warm colors. Batiks, hand-dyes, and hand-painted fabrics have a dappled quality; some commercial fabrics appear to "smolder," an illusion that lends depth and warmth to even the simplest quilts.

Supply List - Teacup Pincushions

Tea Cup & Saucer, cute glass jar, cardke holder

10 inch square of fabric (Cotton, silk, chenille) that enhances your cup, if using a jar two squares.

It is helpful to sew two basting circles onto your square. We will gather these after inserting the filler bag of walnut shells (supplied by Sue). I will have elastic bands for closing the wrap around your fabric as well.

Pretty colored pins, buttons, string of pearls, etc.

Optional are trim such as lace, decorative ribbon, large rick rack, small florettes, small lace doilies
