Sunday Workshop: JELLY ROLL/SPLIT BLADE DRESDEN: This class will be detailing how to make a “Split Blade” Dresden using 2 1/2” strips (Jelly Rolls). # MEETING MINUTES

Ladies of the Lake Quilt Meeting Minutes, February 10, 2018

## General Meeting

The meeting was called to order by President Terry Phelps at 10:00am

**Members and Guests:** Susan Blair announced that there are six guests, one of which has become a new member. **Treasurer Report:** Treasurer Sandra Redshaw reported that the income for the month of January was \$2,449.00, expenses were \$2,151.25 giving a net income of \$297.75.

### Announcements:

President Terry Phelps announced that all membership dues for 2018 are due today.

Grapevine Quilters Guild of Mendocino is visiting today with their Op Quilt.

The guild must appoint a new By-laws Committee. Members of this committee will be Shirley Viada Chairman, Rebecca Scroggins, Sue Schedler, Dottie Kaufman and Donna James.

Linda Morrison announced that there will be a Silent Auction of fabrics during the guild anniversary meeting in May. All donations must be turned in by the April guild meeting. Proceeds will go into the guild general fund.

Betty Fessler announced that Ventura quilters have asked for blocks to be sent to make quilts for families affected by the fires there. Instructions for these blocks will sent via email soon. Betty showed two quilts that have been completed for families in our local area. More are in process. There will be another opportunity for guild members to work on fire quilts on Saturday February 17 at Nancy Hellendorfer's, 1025 Martin St. Lakeport.

Jane Alameda passed around a signup sheet for those who would be interested in classes demonstrating "Back-to-Basics" topics.

**Program:** Jane Alameda introduced our speaker, Pattie Klimek with her lecture "CRAZY QUILT'S- Today and Yesterday". Pattie showed several quilts with a few going back into the 1800's. These quilts display a mixture of fabrics and embellishments. There is a lot of symbolism in old crazy quilts such as military regiments and fraternal organizations. Examples of modern quilts included a crazy quilt tree skirt and the crazy quilt concept on garments. Guild members Claire Grieve, Barbara Hadden and Lan Ali-Adeeb showed their crazy quilts.
