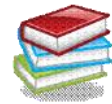
## Treasure Chest—Sue Fairchild & Kitty Jones

### April: ANELIE BELDEN

**Lecture:** “IRON ON TUESDAY” History of Ironing will be presented by Anelie Belden. Listen to interesting stories about the development of irons through time.

Sunday Workshop: JELLY ROLL/SPLIT BLADE DRESDEN: This class will be detailing how to make a “Split Blade” Dresden using 2 1/2” strips (Jelly Rolls). Anelie will teach us using her Modern methods using her stitch-n-flip technique, eliminating the difficulty of getting the Dresden to lay down flat. Several border techniques will also be demonstrated. Grab your Jelly Rolls and make a Dresden Plate with Anelie Belden. Cost of Class is: \$25 **All levels of quilters** will benefit from this class, don't miss an opportunity to learn from Anelie !

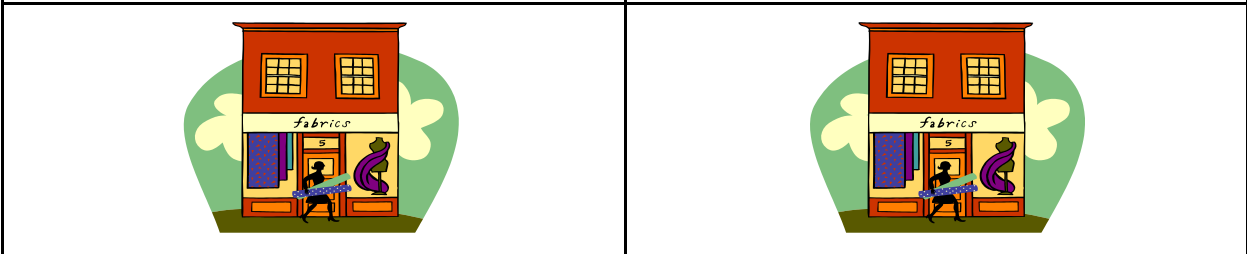
