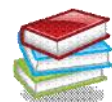


Ways & Means (Lake Works) – Gail Coyle

A class on Sunday will be “Slice of Improv Workshop”. Bring your scraps and see how improvisation piecing is freeing, forgiving and sew incredibly FUN! The class is well-suited to starting quilters, and a refreshing idea/approach for those that have been at it a while!

July: Arlene Arnold from **Heritage Oaks Quilts** in Colusa (Where the stitches of our heritage still live) will do her presentation in costume.

“Stitches of Glory” An hour of seeing, touching, and experiencing many antique quilts & tops dating from 1830 -1890. See what fabrics and patterns our ancestors worked with while they navigated a country shaping itself and its issues.



August: Marjan Kluepfel

Marjan’s presentation “Creative Exploration” is a humorous and educational slide lecture with a trunk show. You will learn about her untraditional approach to quilting and how she creates her hand dyed fabrics.



Sunday Workshop: Dyed Fabrics: They’re ir-rest-able: Learn to create your own beautiful hand-dyed fabrics! You will become familiar with the principles of color theory, fabric dyeing using Procion fiber reactive dyes, and many surface design techniques such as immersion dyeing to create color progressions or value gradations; dye painting; bleach discharge; resist techniques; shibori; stamping and stenciling.

We want to fill our classes, if we fall short of member sign-ups, the class will be offered to quilters outside our guild !

Ladies of the Lake Quilt Meeting Minutes, May 12, 2018

General Meeting

The meeting was called to order by President Terry Phelps at 10:00 am

Members and Guests: There are six guests today: Judi Mooney, Kathy Kitchens, Jane Ahrens, Jan Margoux and Christy Bengston's grandchildren Andrew and Madelyn.

Treasurer Report: Treasurer Sandra Redshaw reported an income of \$2509.60 and expenses of \$2743.38 for the month of April for a loss of \$233.78. She announced that the Guild has established a CD with our bank in the amount of \$15,000.00 for 1 year.

Program: Today's program was a Sale and Auction in celebration of the Guild's 17th Birthday. Linda Morrison was in charge.

Shelly Aldrich, our founder, spoke about her quilting history and how the guild was started and it's early years. She showed three beautiful quilts; one her first quilt, one the Guild's first Opportunity Quilt, and another favorite one. She also talked about the quilt made to cover a car. This quilt will be on display at the Guild Quilt Show the first week of October. Several Guild members spoke about their appreciation for Shelly and all that she had contributed to the Guild and their quilting knowledge.

May Birthdays were announced: Betty Fessler 5/5, Jeanne Netherwood 5/14, Carol Corwin Weiss 5/23, and Kerry Hansing 5/26. The break offered a large assortment of food and a Birthday cake.

Next it was time for all to peruse a large variety of fabrics, thread, patterns and other quilting related items that were for sale. In addition, there was a 1930's era double wedding ring quilt available as a Silent Auction which was won by Marj Sweeney. Three quilt tops and a set of potholders were auctioned off in a "live" auction which brought some very active bidding. Successful bidders were Leanne Harvey, Pat Dandy and Lynda Jones.
