President's Message—Betty Fessler

The May Tea can certainly be called a success! We had 49 members present, many tables' decorated, delicious teas, and foods a plenty, and several contests going. We were a loud and happy group for sure. There were prizes for table decorations, our treasure chest raffle was done twice with double the number of prizes available, and the mystery quilt revealed and a viewer's choice awarded for that. There were many announcements this month so be sure to read the minutes of the meetings for all the news you missed if you weren't in attendance. Special Thanks to Kerry Hansing for organizing this!

There are many celebrated dates for June:

D-Day – June 6th is observed in the U.S. in memory of the Normandy landings in France on June 6, 1944.

Flag Day – June 14th in honor of the United States flag and it's adoption.

Father's Day – 3rd Sunday of June, this year is June 19.

American Eagle Day – June 20th celebrates the day in 1782 when the bird was added to the official seal of the United States. Also known as Bald Eagle Day or National Eagle Day it was first proclaimed by President Bill Clinton in 1995 to commemorate the success of bringing the national bird back from the brink of extinction partially caused by pesticides such as DDT, illegal hunting, and reduced habitat by human activity. The numbers at one time fell down to only 400 in the 1960's. Then DDT was banned and by 1995 the Bald Eagle was removed from the Endangered Species list. In the late 2000s it was estimated that there were about 10,000 nesting pairs.

June Solstice - This year in Lake County, California, June Solstice is on Monday, June 20th at 3:34 PM PDT. This date, which can be anywhere from June 20th to June 22nd in Universal Coordinated Time or UCT largely due to our calendar and depending on the year and which time zone you are in, is both the Longest and Shortest Day of the Year depending on whether you are in the Northern Hemisphere where it is the Summer Solstice or the Southern Hemisphere where it is the Winter Solstice. June 22 as Summer Solstice is rare, the last one on that date was in 1975 and the next is not until 2203. Solstice, from the Latin word solstitium, means Sun stopping, the point on the horizon where the sun appears to rise and set, stops and reverses direction after this day. Although it is more common to use meteorological definitions of seasons making the solstice midsummer or midwinter, June solstice actually marks the first day of astronomical summer for us and astronomical winter for the other hemisphere. On June Solstice, the midnight sun is visible (weather permitting) throughout the night in all areas from just south of the Arctic Circle to the North Pole. On the other side of the planet, south of the Antarctic Circle there is Polar night, meaning no Sunlight at all on June Solstice. Over the centuries June solstices have inspired countless festivals, midsummer celebrations and religious holidays. One of the world's oldest evidence of importance of the Summer Solstice's importance in culture is Stonehenge in England, which clearly marks the moment of the June Solstice. Just so you know, Winter Solstice for us this year is December 21st at 2:44 AM PST, and I hopefully won't be up for that one!

Hello Ladies! I announced at the May Guild Meeting that we would be starting a Round Robin this summer. If you are interested, be sure to read ALL of the following carefully!! Here are the dates that I am going to run it:

Receive RR info, ask questions: June 11 Meeting
Deadline to select and commit to doing the RR: July 9 Meeting

Commitment Dates:

Your starting piece is due: Aug 13 Meeting
First round is due: Sept 10 Meeting
Second round is due: Nov 12 Meeting
Third round is due: Jan 14 Meeting
Fourth & final round is due: Feb 11 Meeting THIS IS THE REVEAL DATE TOO!

I will be offering similar (to last year) formats for the Round Robin. I will provide copies of these at the June meeting. I hope that you were inspired by last year's projects to participate this year. If you want to participate, remember that this is a commitment for every date listed above.

You must be able to complete your portion to meet the above specified deadlines – July thru Feb. Do note that there is no Oct. Guild meeting and nothing is due for the Dec. Guild meeting. You must be able to get your "bag" to the guild meeting and pick up your new bag. That is the ***only*** way that the Round Robin can work!! So check your calendars ahead of time: any trips scheduled, birthdays, anniversaries, babies coming, or other prior commitments that will prevent you from doing your portion? Is there *anything* that will prevent you from getting your "round" done? If so, you will need to wait and try to participate in the next RR. The book is packed with beautiful photos and wonderful stories from the many quilt trail adventures that Suzi, her husband and their dog had as they traveled many back roads in search of barn quilts.

When you read the book, look at the photo of the Thames River block on page 30. I designed the block [the original name is Jacques in the Boat] for a Quilter's Newsletter contest in 1977. The block was a prize winner and was published in QNM in 1978. Someone in Canada found the block and chose it for a barn quilt. I have learned that it's on three different quilt trails in Ontario.
