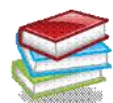

“Stitches of Glory” An hour of seeing, touching, and experiencing many antique quilts & tops dating from 1830 –1890. See what fabrics and patterns our ancestors worked with while they navigated a country shaping itself and its issues.

Marjan’s presentation “Creative Exploration” is a humorous and educational slide lecture with a trunk show. You will learn about her untraditional approach to quilting and how she creates her hand dyed fabrics.



Sunday Workshop: Dyed Fabrics: They’re ir-rest-able: Learn to create your own beautiful hand-dyed fabrics! You will become familiar with the principles of color theory, fabric dyeing using Procion fiber reactive dyes, and many surface design techniques such as immersion dyeing to create color progressions or value gradations; dye painting; bleach discharge; resist techniques; shibori; stamping and stenciling.

Treasurer Report: Sandra Redshaw reports income of \$2174.84 and expenses of 768.71 with a net income of \$1406.13 for the month of May.

Announcements:

Terry introduced three nurses representing the Adventist Hospital of Clearlake who presented the guild with a Thank You card and cookies for the baby quilts donated for all the newborns at their Birth Center.

Program:

Jane Alameda introduced Mel Beach with her “Challenge Yourself!” Lecture and trunk show. She will also conduct a “Slice of Improv Workshop” on Sunday.

Upcoming Programs:

BOARD MEETING MINUTES

The meeting was called to order by President Terry Phelps at 12:17 pm

Present: Terry Phelps, Jane Alameda, Kathy Pratt, Sandra Redshaw, Linda Morrison, Marj Sweeney, Nancy Helldorfer, Shirley Viada, Dottie Kauffman, Debbie Miller, Barbara Haddon

Old Business:

There was no old business

New Business:

Quilt Show Chairman Barbara Haddon made a request to be reimbursed the amount of \$137.24 for the shipping cost of returning the ramps ordered for the quilt show that did not meet ADA requirements. Marj Sweeney made a motion to reimburse this amount. Linda Morrison seconded the motion. There will need to be a budget item added for Quilt Show Expense. The motion was passed unanimously.

Barbara Haddon also made a request that the Guild purchase a projector for use in Quilt Show training and educational presentations. Terry Phelps made a motion to research the cost of a projector and the need for one. Marj Sweeney seconded the motion. The motion was passed unanimously.

Parliamentarian Shirley Viada reports that a review of the By Laws will be done by the end of the year. Sandra Redshaw will be back on the committee to do this review.

Debbie Miller presented a form to be completed to advertise the Quilt Show and the Guild on an electronic sign at the fire station on Olympic Blvd in Clearlake. This form will be completed.

Debbie Miller also made a request to sell tickets at the guild meetings for a quilt to raise funds for Meals on Wheels. Per the By Laws this request is not possible.

Jane Alameda proposed an Educational Scholarship to assist guild members in attending the Pacific International Quilt Show in Santa Clara in October. Kathy Pratt made a motion to establish this Educational Scholarship in the amount of \$2000 to provide a \$100 payment for up to 20 members. Sandra Redshaw seconded the motion. It was discussed that this Scholarship will cover the entry fee, lodging and travel and must be validated by receipts. Each member that receives the Scholarship will be required to do White Glove or Op Quilt responsibilities while attending. Each member will also be required to share her learning experience to the guild. Deadline for members to sign up for this will be at the August Guild meeting on 8/11. Receipts must be turned in by the November Guild meeting on 11/10. During discussion Sandra Redshaw stated the following IRS 501c3 rule for Charitable Organizations and LLQG By Laws Article 2.02: "The GUILD is not organized for personal profit. All activities of the GUILD shall be conducted in such a manner so that no part of the net income benefits any individual except that an individual may be hired as a principal lecturer/teacher by the Executive Board." Following discussion the motion was passed unanimously.

The meeting was adjourned at 1:24 pm
