President's Message—Betty Fessler

Well the July meeting is past and I thought it went well. We covered a lot of business including

The upcoming Quilt Show, the start to find new committee members/ chairmen for 2017, transportation to PIQF, the need for new people to take on the Opportunity Quilt both in making for 2018 and managing the publicity/sales for 2017/ 18. Also discussed was a UFO Day at our normal workshop site for finishing your quilts/ items for our 2016 Falling Leaves show!

I also would like to talk about programs. I realize that many of you do not want to sign up for a class without having seen the program first because you don't really know the speaker and whether what they offer will be of interest to you. Take Mary Boyer who spoke at our July meeting. I did not know her prior to the meeting, and did not really understand what she had to offer. The particular class offered was not one I was currently interested in, but I thought her program was very good and I would have loved a class on either making the woven purse or on quilting with men's ties, wasn't that tie dress gorgeous? A couple of other people mentioned that they would have liked one on working with the zippers.

Because our classes are the next day and we had only one prior signup we had to cancel the class. We have a time period after which we are obligated to pay for our rent of the workshop building and/or the teaching fee for a class whether or not we have people who know they want to take it, and therein is our dilemma, the rent is \$60.00 for the day, and the class fees so far this year have been anywhere from \$300 to \$650 for that day, which does not include the speaking fee, transportation, and room and board! So unless someone wins the lottery and donates several million to the guild so that we can have our own place to meet, give classes, and have our quilt show there, we really can't afford to pay as a guild for classes that members don't take. Most of our speakers have a web presence and we will try to put something on our upcoming speakers on our website so that that you can get a better idea of what they do, but it is up to you to look. So what I'm getting at is that I believe we may have had more interest after the lecture in a class from Mary, which I think is often the case, but also not necessarily in what she was currently prepared to teach. We have a unique opportunity here, both to let a teacher know what we'd be interested in and possibly to accomplish it as well.

Mary has graciously offered to come back and just do a class if that is what we want but we would probably need a full class in order to cover the cost, so if you are interested in a class from Mary please let us know in what so that we could see if we have enough people who are interested and then coordinate with Mary to see if she would be willing to do a class on that particular thing and what it would cost, as well as if we could work it out.

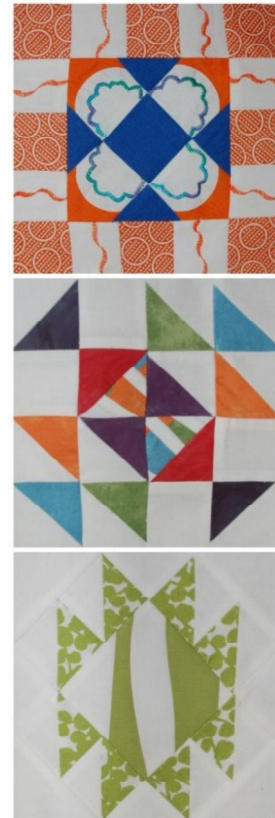
Workshop to finish quilts

Small things like lint, thread removal, the best way to fold without leaving permanent creases. And if you are still putting the pieces together come and join us too. Six hours of camaraderie while piecing or quilting will get you to the finish line. The fee is \$5 to cover the cost of the building rental. Bring lunch. Set up is 9:30 a.m.

LLQG workshops really are geared towards all skill levels and are a lot of fun. Come for the sewing and the camaraderie and you just might learn something new as well. Note that if the classes don't fill with Guild members, they will be open to non-members for a \$10 increase in fee.

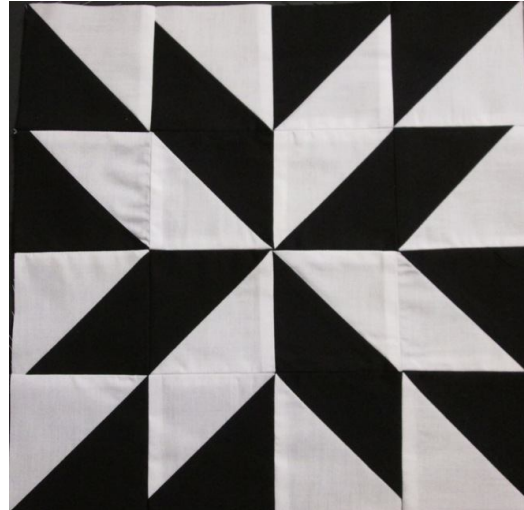
Block of the Month—Judy Oliver
