

# Choose your background fabric for the sky. <br> Next choose 5 different coordinating fabrics to represent the presence of field/foliage, I used different shades of green for mine, but you could decide you want a field with flowers, or one that represents a fallow field with only dirt, etc. <br> All seams are $1 /{ }^{\prime \prime}$. 

From your background fabric cut 2 squares at $53 / 8^{\prime \prime}$, then subcut them diagonally once and set aside.

From your five field fabrics, cut 1 square from each fabric at $41 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ and subcut it diagonally twice, for a total of 4 triangles each. Your will use nine triangles in each of two hills.

1) Lay your field fabric triangles out so that you like the combo of colors. Then start sewing the center four triangle square together by taking the top triangle of the square and sewing it right sides together with either the left triangle or the right triangle of the center square by sewing them together down their sides, not the long edges, they are the sides of the square. Press open and replace in your layout.
2) Next do the bottom triangle of the square and the remaining triangle of the square. Press open and replace in your layout.
3) Now you have two half square triangles, made of the smaller triangles, place these right sides together and sew down the long edge so all four colors meet at the center. Press open and replace the resulting square back in your layout.
4) Next take the two triangles on the bottom left and place them right sides together and sew them down the right side, press open and replace in the layout. Now flip them over onto the square, so that they line up with the left and bottom triangles of the center square, even with the bottom of the square. Sew down the left side. Trim ears.
5) Now take the two triangles on the bottom right side, place them right sides together and sew them down the left side. Press open, trim ears, replace in layout. Next flip this over right sides together lining up even with the bottom of the center square and sew down the right side. Press open and trim dog ears. Then take the resulting unit and fold in half matching the side seams of the center square and finger press in the middle of the top triangle of center square at the top edge.
6) Now take the top triangle of the hill unit and fold it in half on the long edge. Match the fold of this triangle to the fold on the top triangle of the center square unit right side together and sew them together down that long edge. Press open, trim dog ears and replace in layout.
7) Now put the sky fabrics in your layout on either side of the hill. Take your hill and fold the bottom point to the top point of the hill and finger press at the middle on one side. Then do the same with the sky piece on that side. Line up the center marking placing the sky right side together with the hill. Sew your $1 / 4$ " seam, press open and trim ears. Next do the same with the opposite side. Press open, trim ears. Trim resulting rectangle to $5 \times 91 / 2$ " You should have a $1 / 4$ " seam of sky fabric on top of the hill.
8) Repeat all numbered instructions once for the second hill and sky unit.
9) Place the two rectangles one above the other, right sides up and both top points of the hills pointing up. On the top rectangle unit make a finger press mark the middle of the bottom triangle of the four triangle square, then flip the top rectangle down right sides together on top of the bottom rectangle and sew the last seam across the top, so that the center finger press mark of the top unit matches the top of the hill in the bottom rectangle unit. Press open.

You are done!
