

Assembly

<u>Pumpkin Blocks</u> (make 2) Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the B squares. Position the background B squares, right side down, at the corners of each of the orange pumpkins A & A1. Stitch on the line, trim to 1/4", and press.

Stems Position the green square C, right side down, at the right end of the background rectangle D. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the green square C. Stitch on the line, trim to 1/4", and press. Add the background and stem rectangle (D&C) to background E. Repeat for the other pumpkin block.

Sew stem unit (D+C+E) to pumpkin body unit. Repeat.




Nine Patch Blocks (make 2)

Refer to diagram below and sew each set of fall squares together.


You will have 1 G&F block and 1G1&F block

Finish it up

Sew the pumpkin blocks to the 9patch blocks as shown. Press.



Ideas/notes

Add flying geese in between the blocks; make the stem as a square; add a leaf &/or tendril; quilt ribs on the pumpkin body; plaids work well with this seasonal pattern.
