

Mystery Quilt



Introduction

This quilt looks great with 2 contrasting colors (as in blue/white) you could use yardages of the same, or a variety of your color choice. This quilt looks great scrappy with light background. You can use fat quarters or layer cake.

True to my nature mine is scrappy. It takes 3 yards of each light and dark. That is not including the border. This quilt is rated beginner/intermediate and these instructions are for 84" x 84". However, you may easily make it smaller or larger. I give the fabric requirement for 2 sizes.

Fabric Requirements:

	59 ½" x 76 ½"	84 ½" X 84 ½"
PRINTS	9 Fat Quarters	14 Fat Quarters
Background Block	2 ½ Yards	3 ¼ Yards
Border	2 ½ Yards	3 ⅞ Yards
Binding	¾ Yard	1 Yard
Backing	4 ⅞ Yards	7 ⅞ Yards

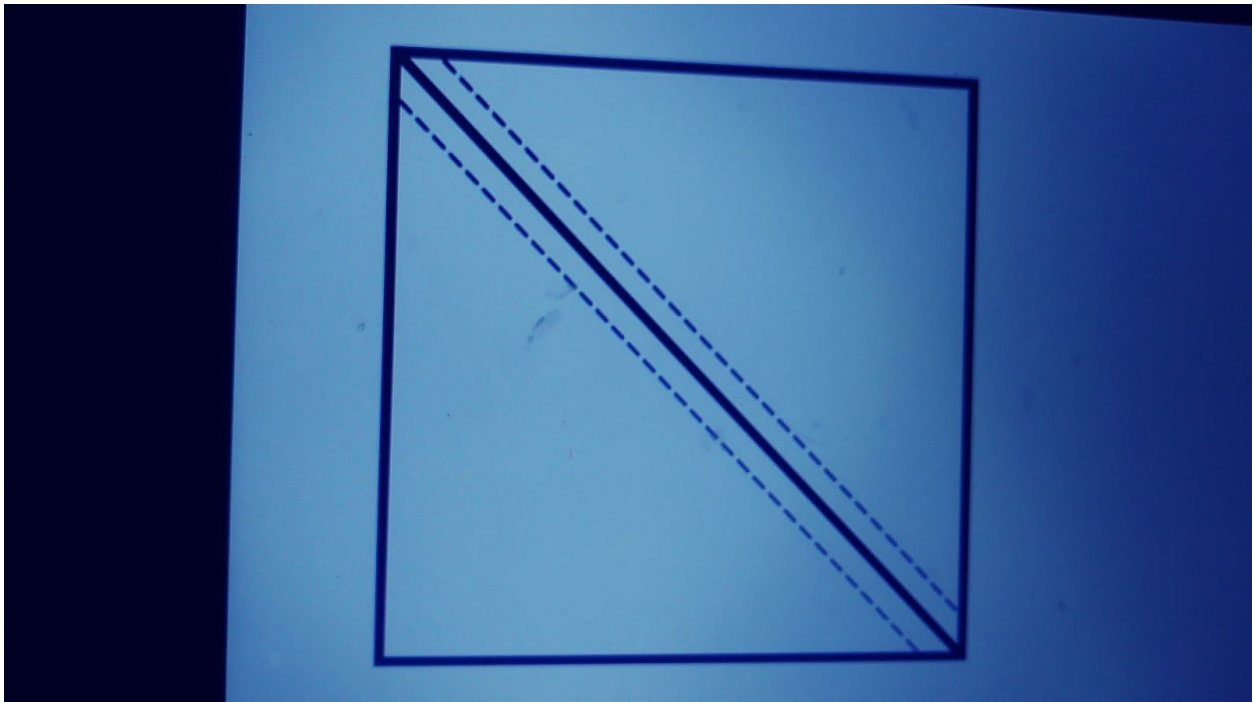
I used 14 fat quarters. I recommend using white, off white or neutral for the background.
My background blocks are also scrappy.

Here are the first clue instructions:

Print	One 10" square (A)
Block background	One 10" square (B)

Right sides facing, layer fabric square A square with fabric B square.

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of square B. Stitch $\frac{1}{4}$ " from each side of drawn line.
Cut apart on marked line. Unit should measure $9\frac{1}{2}$ " x $9\frac{1}{2}$ ".



Make 32 blocks
