Board Meeting Minutes –March 14, 2026

The meeting was called to order at 8:43 a.m. by President Barbara Peebles. A quorum was present.

Location: United Christian Parish – Conf. Room

Old Business

Lake County Art Council (Potential new venue for Monthly Guild Meetings): Lan A. Provided an overview of the BofA building. Kris N. noted there may be an opportunity to transfer the existing insurance to cover the new location (BofA building) at no additional cost; otherwise, a \$35 fee will apply.

Motion & Vote: Unanimously approved for Debbie S. & Barbara P. to engage Lake County Art Council for next steps.

Fairgrounds Reservation for QS 2027 (Debbie S.): Quilt Show (QS) reservation for 2026 has been canceled. We have reserved 2027 QS dates, with an additional setup date: starting Wednesday instead of Thursday. Dates: Sept 29 – Oct 3, 2027

Opportunity Quilt (Kris N./Barbara P.): Discussion on ticket printing quantity based on Pak-n-Mail's pricing. Last year, 6000 tickets were printed and fully utilized.

Motion & Vote: Unanimously approved to print 8000 tickets to cover approximately the next 1.5 years.

Equipment Inventory List (Kris N.): An inventory list may be obtained from Kitty J. or Linda M. or create a new one by Kris, if necessary. All guild documents will be digitized, categorized, and uploaded to member-only webpage. This update will be shared with members at next month's general meeting.

May Birthday Meeting Presentation (Kris N.): A presentation is proposed to celebrate the guild's 25th anniversary, featuring Charter Members and past Presidents with slide show. A request for photos will be announced at today's general meeting. President, Barbara P. to arrange for the cake. Hospitality Chairs, Gail C. & Linda M. will plan other activities.

Volunteer travel expenses and liability (Barbara P.): The guild does not cover volunteer travel expenses. Travel expenses are allocated for attending QGNG meetings to maintain our membership and ensure representation from LLQG.

Donated Items (Lan A.): Discussions included donating three non-functional vintage sewing machines and a large "cutter" quilt top to thrift stores. One vintage Pepsi metal sign and two vintage quilts will be offered for sale to members prior to being listed on eBay.

2025 Firework Contracts and Permits (Barbara P.): No response has been received from the firework company. This item is tabled until the April meeting, as Barbara has been contacted by a representative in Sacramento overseeing firework activities. All relevant documents are expected within one or two weeks.

Sound System (Kris N.): Kris will follow up with Pam and share update.

2026 Country Store Chair (Gretchen M.): Gretchen will serve as Country Store Chair this year, as there will be no QS. Gretchen will organize and manage smaller Country Store tables at selected guild meetings and events.

New Business

Redistribution of Responsibilities (Barbara P.): Member request to redistribute some additional responsibilities (new venue research, membership forms and tracking, and OPP quilt tickets) back to respective Chairs due to personal obligations.

Membership Chair Support (Barbara P.): The board considered purchasing an annual subscription for MS Word to support membership duties. An upgrade to computer Window 11 may also be required. The topic was discussed and decided the guild is not responsible for software purchasing on a member's personal computer.

Lincoln-Leavitt Insurance-Cindy Poindexter (renewal in August): Barbara and Debbie will follow up with the insurance company to confirm the guild's current policies, with particular attention to Error and Omissions, and Liability coverages for Executive Board members.

Publicity Chair (Barbara P.): Lisa V. is slated to serve as Publicity Chair. Membership status will be confirmed.

No Quilt Show in 2026 (Barbara P.): A statement announcing that LLQG will not host a 2026 QS has been posted on the website: <https://www.llqg.org/quilt-show.html>

Bylaws (Kris N.): Kris converted the bylaws from PDF to MS Word format to allow editing and emailed the document to Terry to begin the review process.

June Speaker: Contract is in progress for Kitty Oliver.

Contract Question: If the usage of Presenter's personal contract to secure agreement between Presenter and LLQG is acceptable? If Presenter's Contract covers all necessary stipulations, it is agreeable, although LLQG's contract should be discussed so all stipulations are covered before signing.

New Newsletter Design: sample Newsletters were circulated for member review.

Items for Sale (Lan A.): One vintage Pepsi metal sign and two vintage quilts are being offered to members. These items will be listed on eBay after the April meeting.

May Program (Kris N.): Guild 25th anniversary slide show featuring guild history, Charter Members, and Past Presidents. Kris is requesting photos of past guild activities. Members are encouraged to share any photos they may have. The "Quilt Show of the Past" page on the website is also a helpful resource. President, Barbara Peebles is responsible for the cake and Hospitality Committee will organize games and other party activities.

Programs (Gretchen M.): Kris presented a commission quilt created (in 2024) for the former owner of the Blue Wing Restaurant & Tallman Hotel in Upper Lake. Topics included: History of foundation paper piecing; Foundation paper; New York Beauty pattern and templates; Preparing necktie silk fabrics (taking them apart, washing, pressing with fusible interfacing, and cutting according to patterns/templates). Sewing demonstration of constructing a New York Beauty quilt block.

The Month of April Presenter: Scarlette Rose's presentation has been rescheduled from April to October.

Hospitality (Gail C.): Members with last name A-D to bring refreshments in April.

Bylaws committee (Barbara P.): The bylaws will be reviewed and updated this year by a committee of seven members: the President, one additional member of the Executive Board, the Parliamentarian, and four from the general membership. Renee H. has agreed to be Chairman.

2027 Quilt Show (Barbara P.): The 2027 QS venue and dates have been secured. A QS Chair is still needed.

Travel Expense: The guild does not cover volunteer travel expenses. However, expenses are allocated for attendance at the QGNG meetings because LLQG is a member of the QGNQ Guild and we send our representative to attend their meetings.

PHD (Suzanne L.): Suzanne L. and Leanne H. shared their quilts.

Suzanne also has a large kerosene tank with fuel available at her new home and is offering the fuel free to members. If interested, please bring your own container and contact Suzanne for more information.

Show & Tell: Kris N., Jane A., Suzanne L., Susanne H., Shery L., Lan A., and Kerrie H. shared their quilts. Renee H. shared a few of her paper pieced quilts.

Chairman's Reports:

- **Community Service (Lan A.):** LLES Sewing Club is going very well. The final class ends on April 3.
- **Guild Setup (Pam A.):** Sound system will be here next month. Plant sales at the Grange on May 3, from 9am – 3 pm.
- **Round Robin (Renee S.):** Depending on participation, there may be two groups of five. Each participant will begin with their own 12.5" center block for R.R. Participants to add rows or rounds following specific instructions (e.g., fabrics, or theme). Participants are asked to attach a piece of muslin ironed on to freezer paper as a label for your finished quilt with the signatures of the participants who contributed. Also, a notebook or journal is recommended to follow along with your R.R. Quilt for notes or comments.
- **BOM (Linda D.):** March block is the Friendship Star. Please bring finished blocks to Show & Tell.
